That seed started to germinate when I was completing Art School in 2015 where a brief was to plan "my ideal exhibition" which I sought to bring to fruition by meeting with His Excellency the Honourable Hieu Van Le AC Governor of South Australia, asking him to open my exhibition, an exhibition which sought to have Australians of different walks and origin to present their work under one roof and illustrate that we are all the same inside despite outward differences. Ensuing discussions revealed that there was a real need to create an entity which could help pursue this ideal on an ongoing basis.

Hence the Mahmood Martin Foundation was born, with the aim of using Culture, Discourse and the Arts as vehicles toward promoting Cultural diffusion in Australian Society today.

SECTION 2 GOVERNANCE

#### CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

The first major project planned by the Foundation was the Delima Residency, which was intended to place an Australian artist into a 6 month residency at the Rimbun Dahan Arts Centre in Malaysia, providing them with an immersive experience in an Asian Arts environment from which they would return as ambassadors for intercultural exchange. After over a year of planning and organising, including signing agreements with partner organisations in Adelaide and Malaysia, the project, like so many others, was scuttled by Covid 19. It remains an important focus for the future, however, and we have recently identified a new partner in Adelaide who will be able to provide a further Studio Residency for our returning artists and enable them to present an exhibition as a key outcome of their combined Residencies once the restrictions on international travel are lifted.

In the meantime, we have been exploring other smaller projects which align with our Vision and Mission and have supported several initiatives. These include donations to the National Association for the Visual Arts and to Contemporary Asian Australian Performance to support cross-cultural projects and to the Adelaide Festival of Arts for an interactive "One on One" musical event. We are particularly pleased to have been able to support (as a major sponsor) "In Other Words", a cross-cultural conversation program in the upcoming 2021 OzAsia Festival which aligns perfectly with our vision.

Our group of supporters has continued to grow slowly despite the hiatus in activity and we have received donations from a number of those individuals, which we very much appreciate. We have not yet embarked on any serious fund-raising activities, since our major project, The Delima Residency, remains in limbo at present.

Our Patron, His Excellency the Honourable Hieu Van Le AC Governor of South Australia, is retiring from his position this year. We are delighted that he and Mrs Le have agreed to continue as our Patrons in their personal capacity going forward.

We continue strive to minimise our expenses to ensure the maximum amount of funds are directed to the Purpose of the charity.
